Dear Lenape Families,

We are at the mid-marking period, and as part of our strategy for the current crisis, we need to determine who wishes to come to school and who wishes to learn wholly remotely for the Third Marking Period that begins on January 15, 2021. This formation is vital as we must plan for the implications regarding the number of students in classrooms and on buses. You will receive an e-mail survey to indicate your intention for your child. We need responses from every family by December 21, 2020.

*I wish to remind everyone that Monday January 11, through Friday, January 15, is our mid-term examination week, and that testing is remote for all students. Classes in the hybrid, alternating schedule will resume on Monday, January 18.*

As we plan for the continued operation under the current hybrid model, please make your declaration that for the Third Marking Period (January 15, 2021 to March 17, 2021):

You will either . . .

. . . send your child to be instructed in all classes on-campus during their assigned cohort.

Or

. . . keep them home to participate in all classes remotely. \*

\* This decision will be for the entire Third Marking Period. Families who wish to change their child's status can do so at the Fourth Marking Period.

Your child will . . .

. . . arrive at and depart school by school-provided busing.

Or

. . . not be using any school transportation.

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Our day-to-day operations will continue as in the First and Second Marking Periods, namely with regard to students' cohorts, school hours, and class schedules.

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#### GENERAL PROVISIONS:

All persons within the school will be required to wear masks at all times. Though we have taken precautions to limit the number of people in the building, some classrooms may contain twenty or more students where six feet of distance between persons is impossible.

All persons entering the school will have their temperature taken by a scanner. Anyone who registers at 100.4 degrees or more will be evaluated by our nurse. Students and employees whom the nurse confirms a 100.4-degree temperature or higher will be sent home.

All students and employees are required to complete a COVID questionnaire, daily. A nightly email will be sent via Genesis Parent Portal containing the daily questionnaire to be submitted electronically (a copy of it is attached) before entering the school.

There will be no late busing. Students who participate in activities after the 11:35 a.m. dismissal must arrange for transportation home.

For our free/reduced breakfast and lunch students (or those who wish to purchase) breakfast will be eaten in classrooms and bagged lunches will be provided prior to dismissal.

There will be no large student assemblies, and all field trips are cancelled until further notice.

No guests or visitors will be allowed in the building; conferences will take place virtually.

Upon entering the school, students will report directly to their first class of the day. Lockers will be inaccessible until we can resume normal operations.

One lavatory for each sex will be open per floor, and a monitor will be present to restrict their use to one student at a time.

The flow of traffic into and within the building will be one-directional, guided by queues, arrows, and markings on the floor.

Students who have committed to remote instruction will be permitted to participate in extracurricular activities.

*Parents who have reservations about their child's participation in on-campus education are advised to have their child participate remotely from home.*
